Spring Design Research Workshops: Sharing Collective Knowledge

Throughout February and March, partners from across the Transforming Homes consortium have engaged in a series of Spring Design Research Workshops. These sessions were built around themes from our Design Research to date, including a state-of-the-art review, demonstration homes in Bristol and Swansea, stakeholder and resident interviews, and nationwide co-design charrettes. Each workshop was based around a provocation, associated with topics such as space standards, operational carbon, human comfort and liveability, bio-based materials, architectural heritage, and placemaking.

The outputs will form the foundation for our Design Catalogue. The team are now synthesising this rich body of knowledge ahead of our Consortium Charrette in May. We look forward to seeing how this work shapes the next phase of the project.

Visit to 'Open House' Retrofit in Margam

Transforming Homes researchers recently visited the 'Open House' Retrofit in Margam, part the Homes as Power Stations project (HAPS). The initiative, funded by the UK Governments Shared Prosperity fund was a partnership between the Homes As Power Stations team at Neath Port Talbot Council, the Welsh School of Architecture at Cardiff University and Tai Tarian, showcasing 'real' whole house retrofit of social housing.

The two adjacent homes feature passive improvements such as airtightness and insulation, alongside technologies including an air source heat pump (ASHP), PV, and battery storage aimed at reducing fuel poverty while enhancing comfort, health, and wellbeing. The visit offered valuable insights into practical challenges around planning, design, procurement, installation and maintenance and operation, particularly in contexts where experience in deep retrofit is limited.

The visit has provided us with inspiration for the 10 Transforming Homes demonstration homes. Thanks to the <u>Centre for a Low Carbon Built Environment</u> (CLCBE) team, led by Prof Jo Patterson, and to all those involved in the delivery of this project.
